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REFLECTIONS ON WORSHIP:

1. In Isaiah 61:3 we read that God gives us the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness. Name some ways we can put on this garment.
2. John 15 talks about the importance of abiding in Christ. What does it mean to abide in Him? How might worship figure in here?
3. When believers meet together, one aspect of these gatherings is corporate worship. How does worship play a part in encouraging one another? Why is meeting together so important?
4. Reflect on the Palm Sunday account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem in Luke 19:28-40 and Matthew 21:1-11. List words that best describe what was going on. Name some of the words being ascribed to Jesus.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. Share a few things that stand out to you from today's online service. What impacted you the most? What was your favorite part? Why?
2. Put yourself in the disciple's shoes during the week leading up to Christ's death. Can you relate to how the disciples must have felt from the time of Jesus' triumphal entry to his arrest and crucifixion? What words would you associate for how you would feel if you were there?
3. Where do people put their hope? Does it matter where we put our hope? Why?
4. Why do you think we often fail to recognize God in our lives when things aren't going well? Why is it so important that we have practices like communion to aid in reminding us of all Jesus did for us through His suffering and death on the cross?
