BIBLE VERSES:

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REFLECTIONS ON WORSHIP:

1. It's so important to mediate on Christ's death and resurrection. As you enter into a time of worship using the playlist provided consider what each means to you personally.
2. What emotions would you associate with the cross and Christ's death? What feelings do you associate with His resurrection? How might these emotions and expressions be reflected appropriately in your worship of God?
3. How can joy help you endure and walk through hard things? How does worship help renew joy in our lives? Hint: Psalm 16:11 and Nehemiah 8:10

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. As you reflect on the narrative in Luke 24, which characters do you most relate to? Why?
2. In 1 Corinthians, Paul talks about all those who saw Jesus alive after His death on the cross. Jesus tells the disciples he is not a ghost. He tells them to "handle" him, to touch and feel him. Jesus even ate a piece of fish in front of them. What is the significance of all of these references? What does it mean?
3. What kinds of "dead" things do people look to for life? Are there any areas of your life where you are looking to the wrong things hoping to find life instead of looking to Jesus?
4. What is the hope of the resurrection? How does it relate to John 10:10? What does it mean in the life to come? What does it mean today? What does it mean on Monday morning?
5. Are there any stones you need Jesus to move?
